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**1. Call to Order**

**2. Freedom of Information Act Compliance**

Public notification of this meeting has been published, posted, and mailed in compliance with the Freedom of Information Act and the Town of Hilton Head Island requirements.

**3. Approval of Minutes**

**a. Regular Public Safety Committee Meeting of November 4, 2013**

A motion to approve the minutes of the November 4, 2013 meeting of the Public Safety Committee was made by Mr. Harkins and seconded by Mr. McCann. The motion was approved by a vote of 3-0.

**4. Unfinished Business**

**a. Yard Debris Removal Options**

Greg DeLoach, Assistant Town Manager, announced that before the options are discussed, he would like the Committee's permission for the Staff Attorney to review with them the process of identification of individuals and how public funds can and cannot be used.

Brian Hulbert, Staff Attorney, reviewed the legal issues surrounding a yard debris collection program. Legal concerns he identified during his research included the requirement that public money must be expended for public purpose. He noted that the SC Supreme Court had determined that all monies coming into the Town are considered public money. He cautioned that any program developed that spends public money must benefit the many and not the few.

Chairman Grant and Mr. Hulbert discussed the issues involved in an income based eligibility program. Mr. Hulbert indicated while there are precedents for such Federal and State programs, his concern is that while the collection of garbage and debris is a service that the Town can provide, any such service must be provided equally to all taxpayers without preference, or a fee should be charged to receive the service. He did indicate that the Town Attorney, Gregg Alford, had given a differing opinion that it may be permissible to have an income eligible program. Mr. Hulbert disagreed with that opinion, and noted a successful legal challenge could result in penalties.

Noting the difference of opinion, Mr. McCann questioned if a suggestion was being made for postponement of a decision until the legal issues are resolved. Mr. Hulbert indicated he was not making a recommendation, but only expressing legal concerns that the Committee should be aware of before deciding on a course of action that might subject the Town to a legal challenge. He noted he had no such legal concerns as to Option 1, which makes the program available to the entire Town, and to Option 4, which does not involve expenditure of public funds. In response to Mr. Harkins' inquiry, Mr. Hulbert confirmed that a program available to the entire Island on any Town owned property would not raise legal concerns, or if the Town made Town property available occasionally for use by a non-profit or association for collection of debris, if no public funds were utilized.

Mr. DeLoach outlined the efforts that had been undertaken by Jayme Lopko, Senior Planner, and Julian Walls, Facilities Manager, in meetings with several Ward representatives. He noted the results of the meetings, as well as the public education efforts undertaken after adoption of the Ordinance banning open burning, were all set forth in the Memo included in the agenda packet.

Mr. DeLoach briefly outlined Option 4, which combined the public education effort with the suggestion the Committee made earlier to develop a community-based resolution. He noted the Community Foundation of the Lowcountry has provided some additional ideas to be considered with Option 4, including approaching non-profit organizations, posting volunteer opportunities on the website for Community Foundation of the Lowcountry, enlisting the aid of local construction and landscaping companies, and an expansion of the United Way Day of Caring.

Mr. DeLoach noted that the pros and cons of each Option were outlined fully in the Memo, and Town Staff was available to answer any questions. When asked by Mr. Harkins for Staff recommendation, Mr. DeLoach noted that this is purely a policy matter for Town Council, but Option 4 would be Staff's recommendation. With the Town operating in the role as a catalyst, as requested by Town Council, and working with community-based programs, he explained that the Town Staff would attempt to fashion an island-wide program for the spring and fall seasons.

The Committee members and Mr. DeLoach discussed certain specifics about Option 4, including costs that would be borne by the non-profit and/or funds raised in the community. Mr. DeLoach clarified for Mr. Harkins that Option 4 would be tested and evaluated for 1 year, with the public education effort continuing, concurrent with seeking to engage a non-profit organization to take the lead in establishing a program by spring.

Chairman Grant asked for public comment.

Dot Law, President of the Marshland/Chaplin/Gardner POA, stated the position of the POA was to return to a policy of fining those who are violating the burning regulations, which she noted was not a huge problem, rather than turning to non-profits or Ward 1 to pay for a perceived problem.

Charles Young, III, Operations Manager for Native Island Business and Community Affairs Association, stated his agreement there was no big problem with open burning, and citizens should be allowed to continue to burn with fines imposed for non-compliance with the regulations.

Thomas Curtis Barnwell, III, of the Stoney/Chaplin/Wildhorse/Gumtree Road POA, stated there were many who could not attend this morning's meeting, and suggested further meetings with the community. He noted their total disagreement with the ban on yard debris burning, which practice has occurred for generations. He also noted that owners of larger tracts of land need the ability to burn tree debris from storms.

Perry White, a resident of Beach City Road in Ward 6, cited the history of unequal services provided to citizens of the Town. He suggested that if the Town could not provide a needed service to its citizens for removal of yard debris, then it should get rid of the ordinance creating the situation.

Thomas C. Barnwell, Jr. expressed various concerns, including the timing for a solution to replace the burning option, whether monitoring is in place for citations or tickets issued for burning since the ban, and the fact that older citizens are unable to remove their yard debris and have no other options than burning. He supported the idea of legally re-adjusting the law to allow burning.

Louis Rivers, representing the Baygall POA, added his support to a return to burning yard debris, and asked for reconsideration of the Ordinance banning such burning.

Irvin Campbell, President of the Spanish Wells/Jonesville POA, agreed with the prior comments, and noted it is time for the Town to do what is right for all. He recommended reconsidering and repealing the burning ban Ordinance, and enforcing the law instead of changing it.

There were no further public comments. Further discussion ensued among the Committee members and Mr. DeLoach concerning possible changes to Option 4 to make the program available to all Island residents with funding provided by the Town. Mr. DeLoach also clarified for Curtis Barnwell that the burning ban Ordinance does allow for open burning by special permit in exceptional circumstances such as natural disaster, windstorms, hurricane, and tornadoes.

Each Committee member stated their support for Option 4 with funding provided by the Town, and each stated their positions and reasoning leading to such decisions. Mr. McCann also suggested that meetings concerning this issue be scheduled for 6:00 PM rather than 4:00 PM so that working citizens could attend and voice their opinions.

Chairman Grant stated while open burning has been banned, the Council is committed to find a way to dispose of yard debris that will not create a burden to those who cannot afford to pay or for the elderly. He asked for his constituents to continue to work with the Committee and Council to find such a solution, and that efforts be made to provide Town funding. Following discussions between Chairman Grant and Mr. Harkins, a motion that the Committee recommend for consideration by Town Council that Option 4 be adopted on a 1-year basis with funding provided by the Town was made by Chairman Grant and seconded by Mr. McCann. The motion was approved by a vote of 3-0.

## **DATA SOURCE/CRITERIA**

All law enforcement agencies in the state compile incident-based data on crimes occurring in their jurisdiction. While one incident can result in multiple offenses being tracked in the local system, only data that meets the national criteria is forwarded to the SC Law Enforcement Division.

Currently if a burglary is reported and property stolen, two offenses are tracked locally but only the major crime, burglary, is reported using the South Carolina Incident-Based Reporting System. This data is collected by SLED and then forwarded to the FBI, which administers the Uniform Crime Reporting (UCR) program.

The Beaufort County Sheriff's Office will begin using the UCR criteria to account for crime in this report so that it will more closely match the data published by the FBI.


Crimes Against Persons will include Murder, Aggravated Assault, Robbery and Forcible Rape.

Crimes Against Property will include Burglary, Larceny and Auto Theft.  
Vehicle Collisions will remain the same as they are not reportable UCR crimes.

This report is based only on the crimes that occurred on Hilton Head Island.

These statistics are compiled using the following Uniform Crime Reporting (UCR) criteria:

**Murder and non-negligent manslaughter:** The willful killing of one human being by another. Any death due to injuries received in a fight, quarrel, assault or commission of a crime is classified in this category.

**Aggravated Assault:** An unlawful attack by one person upon another wherein the offender uses a weapon or displays it in a threatening manner, or the victim suffers obvious severe or aggravated bodily injury (involving apparent broken bones, loss of teeth, possibly internal injury, severe laceration, loss of consciousness due to injury, etc.)

**Robbery:** Taking or attempting to take, under confrontational circumstances, anything of value from another person by force or threat of force or violence and/or by putting the victim in fear of immediate harm.

**Forcible Rape:** Any sexual act directed against another person, forcibly and/or against the persons will; or not forcibly or against the person's will where the person is unable to give consent. A person may unable to give consent due to: very young or very old, mental or physical incapacity, intoxication, the influence of drugs.



**Burglary/Breaking & Entering:** The UNLAWFUL ENTRY into a building or other structure with the intent to commit a serious crime or theft.

**Structure:** A structure is defined as a building or walled enclosure which can be enclosed on all sides by closing doors or windows.

Motor vehicles, motor homes, trailers and other mobile property are NOT structures. Some mobile property may be made immobile.

**Larceny:** The unlawful taking of property from the possession or constructive possession of another person. Types of larceny include: pocket picking, purse snatching, shoplifting, theft from a building theft from coin operated machine or device, theft from a motor vehicle, theft of motor vehicle parts and thefts from enclosures, etc, and from residences where no unlawful entry of a structure is involved.

**Motor Vehicle Theft:** Theft of a motor vehicle. This does not include using a motor vehicle without the expressed consent of the owner.


