Good afternoon Hilton Head Islanders and Guests,

Here's an update on what's happening around Town:

#### **Town Council Extends Mask Requirement Ordinance**

In the health and public safety interest of Town residents and guests, the Town Council voted to extend its Emergency Ordinance requiring individuals to wear face coverings in certain circumstances and locations in the Municipal limits of the Town, effective now through January 31, 2021. Town Council cited following recommendations from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention and S.C. Department of Health and Environmental Control among reasons for continuing to extend the ordinance. Both agencies advise the use of cloth or other types of face coverings to slow the spread of COVID-19 in our communities and reduce the demand on the local health care delivery system.

### Hilton Head Island Fire Rescue Telecommunicators Receives Resuscitation Trailblazer Award

RQI Partners and the Resuscitation Academy Foundation presented our Hilton Head Island Fire Rescue Telecommunicators, our 911 dispatchers, with the "Resuscitation Trailblazer" Award. The award signifies Hilton Head Island Fire Rescue's commitment to furthering resuscitation education, improving telephone CPR practices, and ultimately, increasing cardiac arrest survival. RQI Partners is a partnership between the American Heart Association and Laerdal Medical that is dedicated to improving survival from cardiac arrest by bringing new solutions to resuscitation education and quality improvement. We salute our Fire Rescue for advancing resuscitation education and preparing public safety telecommunicators to provide telephone CPR.
